
Our EECD SIG has many talented scholars worthy of recognition. We celebrated their achievements and contributions with our SIG annual awards.

Congratulations to all the award recipients and many thanks to the committees served on these awards. I would like to express my hearty gratitude to our board members who led these tasks.

On May 6, 2021, our SIG hosted the first webinar titled 'Anti-bias education in early childhood.' Two presenters, Stephanie Curenton-Jolly and Tonia Durden, shared their knowledge and experience and responded to previously collected questions from our EECD members. Nomination Call for 2022 EE/CD SIG Board Members

The Early Education and Child Development (EE/CD) SIG #32 is now accepting nominations for the following board leadership positions.

Chair-Elect (2-year term)

The Chair-elect shall be responsible for assisting the Chair during their 2 year term. Other specific responsibilities include: organizing the SIG reception at the annual business meeting (with the Secretary/Treasurer), overseeing the nominations process, and planning the business meeting. In the event that the Chair is not available to chair the annual business meeting, the Chair-elect shall convene the meeting. There shall be an automatic succession of the following offices, from Chair-elect to Chair, in that order such that the person elected as Chair-elect shall automatically assume the office of Chair following the completion of one term (two years) as Chair-elect.

Secretary/Treasurer (2-year term)

The Secretary/Treasurer shall be responsible for managing and reporting on the financial accounts of the SIG and the safe keeping of all financial documents of the SIG.

Senior Member-at-Large (2-year term)

One senior member-at-large shall serve as a member of the nominations committee, and one senior member-at-large shall be responsible for managing the Early Career Awards (soliciting nominations, creating a committee, deciding winners). Designation of these duties will be determined by the SIG Executive Committee.

Junior Member-at-Large (2-year term)

One junior member-at-large shall be responsible for managing the Dissertation Awards (soliciting nominations, creating a committee, deciding winners), and one junior member-at-large shall be responsible for managing the Travel Awards (soliciting nominations, creating a committee, deciding winners). Designation of these duties will be determined by the SIG Executive Committee.

Graduate Student Representative (1-year term) The Graduate Student Representative shall be responsible for attending to special project (s) at the discretion of the Chair. Other specific responsibilities include graduate recruitment to and involvement in the SIG.

Nominees must be current members of AERA and the Early Education and Child Development SIG. If you're nominating someone else, please be sure to communicate with the nominee and get their agreement and biographical statement prior to filling out the nomination form. In order to nominate yourself or someone else, you must provide the following information using this nomination form:

- The full name of each candidate;
- The institutional affiliation of each candidate;
- The email address of each candidate;
- A biographical statement for each candidate, which can be up to 200 words.

The deadline for submitting your nomination has been extended to October 8, 2021.

Seeking Nominations for the 2022 Early Career Award

The EE/CD SIG is soliciting nominations for our *Early Career Award*. All nominations and required materials should be submitted to X. Christine Wang (wangxc@gmail.com) by November 1, 2021, 11:59pm EST.

The committee urges all EE/CD SIG members to consider nominating a deserving early career scholar. The award recipient will be notified in February 2022 and recognized at the EE/CD SIG Business Meeting at the AERA meeting. Please see the description and nomination guidelines below.

Early Career Award is made annually to an individual with an early and promising record as a researcher and scholar in the early childhood field, as evidenced through competitive publications and other scholarly activity suggesting a vital research agenda. Recipients of this award receive a \$500 monetary prize and are invited to present a brief synopsis of their research and interests at the SIG business meeting.

Eligibility Criteria

- Viable candidates for the EE/CD Early Research Career Award are no more than 10 years out from receiving their doctorate and have not received tenure.
- 2. Nominators must be members of the EE/CD SIG.
- 3. Nominees from previous years who did not receive the award are encouraged to apply if they still meet the eligibility criteria above.

Application Materials

- 1. A letter of nomination from a member of the EE/CD SIG, with sufficient justification of the nominee's qualifications.
- 2. A letter of support from a second scholar in the field, who can speak to the nominee's qualifications as well. The second letter does not have to come from a member of the EE/CD SIG.
- 3. A copy of the nominee's most recent Curriculum Vitae, including complete bibliographic information and present employment status.
- 4. Copies of 2 or more publications representative of the nominee's scholarly contributions to the early childhood/child development field thus far.

The EE/CD SIG is pleased to once again offer a competitive funding opportunity for graduate student members of the SIG who plan to attend the 2022 Annual Meeting. We plan to provide multiple awards to help fund student travel to AERA. Grants will be awarded to students presenting at the conference, with preference given to first-time AERA presenters.

To qualify for the grant, students should provide the following information in a single email with attachments:

- Proof of membership in the EE/CD SIG
- A statement of your plans to attend AERA this year and how this will enhance your professional development
- A copy of the letter of acceptance from AERA
- A one-page letter of nomination from a faculty member of the EE/CD SIG who knows your work

The deadline for submission is **November 15, 2021**.

Seeking Applications for the 2022 Outstanding Dissertation Award

Annually, the EE/CD SIG awards the Outstanding Dissertation Award for a recent dissertation of exceptional merit. The recipient will receive a plaque from the SIG and a monetary gift at the EE/CD SIG Business meeting. The recipient also receives an automatic invitation to present the dissertation work as part of the EE/CD Business Meeting. The EE/CD SIG is soliciting nominations for our Dissertation Award. **All nominations and required materials should be submitted to this nomination form by November 1, 2021**. Contact Dissertation Award Committee Chair Bethany Wilinski (bethanyw@msu.edu) with any questions about the award or nomination process.

The criteria for this award are:

- 1) A completed and defended dissertation accepted by the Graduate School of the nominee's university within two years of the deadline for submission.
- 2) A study that investigates a topic related to the development of children between birth and age 8, including studies focused on families, teachers and others who care for and educate young children;
- 3) A nominating professor who is a current member of AERA.

To be considered for the award, please complete <u>this nomination form</u> and upload the materials listed below. Please include the nominee's name in the file name for all materials.

- One letter of faculty endorsement from a member of the student's dissertation committee who is an AERA member, attesting that the dissertation was completed by the student during the time period specified and that the faculty member nominating or endorsing the nomination served on the dissertation committee. Please also include the oral defense date. This letter should include a brief clarification of the purposes, scope, and quality of the student's dissertation research, as well as an explanation of how the dissertation contributes to the field of early childhood, child development, or early education. This letter can be uploaded to the google form or sent directly to Bethany Wilinski (bethanyw@msu.edu) with the subject line "EECD Dissertation Award." All other materials must be uploaded to the google form.
- A single Word document or PDF that contains:
 - o **Title page for the dissertation** (including university/college, name of the professor chairing the dissertation committee and a complete list of committee members). In addition, please add to the title page complete contact information (postal and e-mail) of either the student or the nominator that can be used for all correspondence regarding the award.
 - o Table of Contents from the dissertation.
 - o 1-2 page summary (abstract) of the study to be published in the SIG newsletter should the award be given to the recipient.
 - o Scholarly summary of the dissertation, written by the nominee. This summary should adhere to the APA manual's (7th ed.) guidelines for manuscript preparation and should be approximately 15-20 pages (double spaced). The summary should provide an overview of the dissertation study, including: objectives/purpose; perspectives/theoretical framework; methods/mode of inquiry; data sources and analyses; results/discussion; and conclusion and educational/scientific importance of study. The summary will be evaluated by a panel of scholars in the field and former dissertation winners. Please note that *all* nominees are required to submit a summary, regardless of dissertation format (e.g. traditional dissertation or three article dissertation).

Eligibility Criteria:

- 1) Dissertation topic should be congruent with the award purposes as described above.
- 2) The dissertation was completed within the past two academic years (2019-2020 or 2020-2021).
- 3) Nominees are encouraged to become a member of the EE/CD SIG if not already members. However, membership is not required.
- 4) Self-nominations will be accepted.
