Chair's Message

Dear Early Education and Child Development (EECD) SIG Members,

Welcome to a wonderful new academic year filled with possibilities as we plan for and eagerly await spring of 2023 when our AERA Conference will be held in Chicago, Illinois and virtually. In this letter, I will recap some of the highlights of the 2022 Annual Meeting which took place in hybrid form in San Diego, California, and virtually, as well as summarize new EECD SIG activities and preview some conference highlights.

Before I touch on the 2022 AERA conference details and the achievements of the SIG in 2022, I would like to recognize Dr. Myae Han, of the University of Delaware, who served the SIG as Chairperson for two very challenging years (2020-2022) due to many difficulties, including a global pandemic. Myae's work involved an incredible amount of thought, creativity, flexibility, and orchestration behind the scenes to pull off two conferences and sets of meetings and workshops during these years in virtual and hybrid form. I, like so many others, was awed by Myae's leadership gifts and want to both recognize her and acknowledge that we still thankfully have her wisdom as a resource to the SIG as she has transitioned to Past Chair. Many thanks and congratulations to the presenters, we appreciate your willingness to spread your expertise to upcoming scholars and mentors in early childhood education and child development. I would like to give a special round of thanks to Valkessha Marshall, of the University of New Orleans, for helping to create a great advertisement for this event.



SEEKING NOMINATIONS for 2023 AERA EE/CD SIG BOARD MEMBERS

The Early Education and Child Development (EE/CD) SIG #32 is now accepting nominations for the following board leadership positions.

Senior Member-at-Large (2-year term)

One senior member-at-large shall serve as a member of the nominations committee, and one senior member-at-large shall be responsible for managing the Early Career Awards (soliciting nominations, creating a committee, and deciding winners). Designation of these duties will be determined by the SIG Executive Committee.

Junior Member-at-Large (2-year term)

One junior member-at-large shall be responsible for managing the Dissertation Awards (soliciting nominations, creating a committee, deciding winners), and one junior member-at-large shall be responsible for managing the Travel Awards (soliciting nominations, creating a committee, deciding winners). Designation of these duties will be determined by the SIG Executive Committee.

Newsletter Editor (3-year term)

The newsletter editor shall be responsible for publishing and disseminating at least 2 SIG newsletters per year, in fall and spring, via electronic format. The Newsletter Editor shall also be responsible for transmitting the newsletters to the AERA office and providing an annual report to the chair.

Graduate Student Representative (1-year term) The Graduate Student Representative shall be responsible for attending to special project (s) at the discretion of the Chair. Other specific responsibilities include graduate recruitment to and involvement in the SIG.

Nominees must be current members of AERA and the Early Education and Child Development SIG. If you're nominating someone else, please be sure to communicate with the nominee and get their agreement and biographical statement prior to filling out the nomination form. In order to nominate yourself or someone else, you must provide the following information using this nomination form:

- The full name of each candidate
- The institutional affiliation of each candidate
- The email address of each candidate
- A short biographical for each candidate (max. 250 words)

SEEKING NOMINATIONS for the 2023 EARLY CAREER AWARD

The EE/CD SIG is soliciting nominations for our Early Career Award. The committee urges all EE/CD SIG members to consider nominating a deserving early career scholar. The award recipient will be notified in February 2023 and recognized at the EECD SIG Business Meeting at the 2023 AERA meeting. Please see description and nomination guidelines below.

Early Career Award is made annually to an individual with an early and promising record as a researcher and scholar in the early childhood field, as evidenced through competitive publications and other scholarly activity suggesting a vital research agenda. Recipients of this award receive a \$500 monetary prize and are invited to present a brief summary of their research and interests at the SIG business meeting.

Eligibility Criteria

- 1. Viable candidates for the EE/CD Early Research Career Award are no more than 10 years out from receiving their doctorate and have not received tenure.
- 2. Nominees must be members of the EE/CD SIG.

 Note. Nominees from previous years who did not receive the award are encouraged to apply, if they still meet the eligibility criteria above.

Application Materials

- 1. A letter of nomination from a scholar, with sufficient justification of the nominee's qualifications.
- 2. A copy of the nominee's most recent Curriculum Vitae, including complete bibliographic information and present employment status.
- 3. Copies of 2 or more publications representative of the nominee's scholarly contributions to the early childhood/child development field thus far.

SEEKING NOMINATIONS for the 2023 OUTSTANDING DISSERTATION AWARD

Annually, the EE/CD SIG awards the Outstanding Dissertation Award for a recent dissertation of exceptional merit. The recipient will receive a plaque from the SIG and a monetary gift at the EE/CD SIG Business meeting. The recipient also receives an automatic invitation to present the dissertation work as part of the EE/CD Business Meeting. The EE/CD SIG is soliciting nominations for our Dissertation Award. **All nominations and required materials should be submitted to this nomination form by November 4, 2022**. Contact Dissertation Award Committee Chair Anamarie Whitaker (awhit@udel.edu) with any questions about the award or nomination process.

The criteria for this award are:

- A completed and defended dissertation accepted by the Graduate School of the nominee's university within two years of the deadline for submission.
- 2) A study that investigates a topic related to the development of children between birth and age 8, including studies focused on families, teachers and others who care for and educate young children;
- 3) A nominating professor who is a current member of AERA.

To be considered for the award, please complete <u>this nomination form</u> and upload the materials listed below. Please include the nominee's name in the file name for all materials.

- One letter of faculty endorsement from a member of the student's dissertation committee who is an AERA member, attesting that the dissertation was completed by the student during the time period specified and that the faculty member nominating or endorsing the nomination served on the dissertation committee. Please also include the oral defense date. This letter should include a brief clarification of the purposes, scope, and quality of the student's dissertation research, as well as an explanation of how the dissertation contributes to the field of early childhood, child development, or early education. This letter can be uploaded to the google form or sent directly to Anamarie Whitaker (awhit@udel.edu) with the subject line "EECD Dissertation Award." All other materials must be uploaded to the google form.
- A single Word document or PDF that contains:
 - **Title page for the dissertation** (including university/college, name of the professor chairing the dissertation committee and a complete list of committee members). In addition, please add to the title page complete contact information (postal and e-mail) of either the student or the nominator that can be used for all correspondence regarding the award.
 - **Table of Contents** from the dissertation.
 - **1-2 page summary** (abstract) of the study to be published in the SIG newsletter should the award be given to the recipient.
 - Scholarly summary of the dissertation, written by the nominee. This summary should adhere to the APA manual's (7th ed.) guidelines for manuscript preparation and should be approximately 15-20 pages (double spaced). The summary should provide an overview of the dissertation study, including: objectives/purpose; perspectives/theoretical framework; methods/mode of inquiry; data sources and analyses; results/discussion; and conclusion and educational/scientific importance of study. The summary will be evaluated by a panel of scholars in the field and former dissertation winners.

Please note that *all* nominees are required to submit a summary, regardless of dissertation format (e.g., traditional dissertation or three article dissertation).

Eligibility Criteria:

- Dissertation topic should be congruent with the award purposes as described above.
- 2) The dissertation was completed within the past two academic years (2020-2021 or 2021-2022).
- 3) Nominees are encouraged to become a member of the EE/CD SIG if not already members. However, membership is not required.
- 4) Self-nominations will be accepted.
